or dine at RCC.

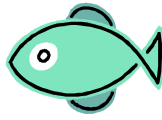

“The Dutch Hollow Freedom Run Rides again” By Mark Triller

Dutch Hollow Lake is a special retreat for the many that come to enjoy the rolling hills, clear water, and quiet nights of summer here. Independence Day, July 4th, really has this community buzzing with hints of BBQs, boating, the VFW post presentation and the Dutch Hollow Freedom Run. What? You haven’t heard of the “Freedom Run?” This is a tradition that the Triller-Eiesland family on Amsterdam Court has had going for six years “running.” The idea started when Mark Triller wanted to introduce a new tradition to his family that includes six children and his wife Annika. The plan was to celebrate freedom and to reflect on what God has given to all of us. The competition of running a race up and down the hills of

Dutch Hollow proved to be a great motivation, and a challenge, for all the participants.

The inaugural year of the run was 2006. The race consisted of Mark running against his six children and wife. They would each run a portion of the race against Dad relay style. The race starts at the flagpole of Siv Eiesland’s house on Amsterdam Court and proceeds up and down North Dutch Hollow Road, up the treacherous “Heartattack Hill” also known as Clubhouse drive, and swings around to the beach area and culminates with a swim to the raft. The first year’s race met with a little apprehension among some of the Triller kids. Maggie Triller, seven at the time, decided that running up

Amersterdam Court was “too hard” so she sat on the street and pouted until her dad picked her up and urged her on. Leif-Erik Triller, the youngest runner at age four and a half, had to wait for his teammate to make it to him. He complained of being left in a “buggy place” as he was waiting near the weeds for his sister to pass him the baton. Run I had a rather controversial ending and the kids nipped dad in the end by an eyelash. They felt they were “given” the victory and began plotting for next year’s run. No more pouting or complaining. The game was on! Next year they were ready. Dutch Hollow II saw an improved kids team that had plotted their course and were encouraged to finish by oldest sisters Karina and Kirsten. The kids totally torched Dad in the sequel

and he vowed to get some help the next year.

Since then we have had friends and visitors participate in the Dutch Hollow Freedom run. We have even introduced this strange tradition to visiting family from Norway (Dutch Hollow Run V) and Sweden (Dutch Hollow Run VI). Sometimes the adults race against the kids and other times the males will take on the females. Yes there is always a team that finishes first. Of course it follows that there is a team that finishes *not first*. I have been on the “not first team” five of the six years including this year. One thing about the Dutch Hollow Freedom Run that is wonderful, however, is that it reminds everyone that

LOTTERY FOR 2012 BEACH HOUSE RESERVATIONS

The process for securing reservations for the next summer season (2012) will remain the same as last year.

For 2012 reservation requests, we will accept written applications up until **September 9, 2011** by mail. On September 10, 2011 at the regular monthly Board of Directors meeting, the Board will draw the applications on a lottery basis.

All applications must be submitted on the following form and must be received at the Association office no later than 9-9-11. With these lottery applications you will be considered for a one-week rental per member.

In the event that not all the available weeks are requested by the lottery applications, phone reservations will be taken beginning September 12, 2011 for the remaining weeks.

The weekly rental period remains Saturday to Saturday and the summer season begins Saturday, May 26, 2012, and continues thru Saturday, September 1, 2012. (After the above peak rental period it may be reserved for a two night minimum stay if desired.)

All applicants will be notified by mail of the results of the lottery. Deposits will be required 30 days after your reservation is made, and reservation will be canceled if deposit is not received by deadline specified.

Your timely application does not guarantee your request will be granted. THIS IS A LOTTERY.

freedom might come first to some and later to others but the important thing is that it does come. Participating in the race, enjoying the race and finishing the race is the goal.

Before we begin the race the runners gather together for a prayer. This year was particularly difficult because we had suffered the loss of Wally Eiesland, longtime race judge and race starter. In Dutch Hollow Run II we began with a prayer from Colossians 3:17 that reads, "Whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus giving thanks to the Father through him." It served as an important reminder to us all that God has given us the ability to move (our youngest

runner this year was three and our oldest was 70) and also to appreciate the beauty of the surroundings around Dutch Hollow Lake. We are family and friends brought together by God to enjoy his beauty and a tradition that keeps on growing (we had 22 runners this year).

So if you find yourself driving on Clubhouse Drive on July fourth and see struggling runners holding a baton and passing it to teammates with lots of enthusiasm and little running ability, understand they are celebrating freedom in a unique way--running because they can and grateful to God for providing freedom, friends and family in the beauty that we know as Dutch Hollow.
